It Was Show and Tell!

The first meeting of the Dane County Area Genealogical Society (DCAGS) was a great success, with over 50 people attending.

Sherry Lloyd began the meeting by announcing the recent vote for the merger. For DCGS, 73 responses were returned out of 102 mailed. The vote was 93 for adoption out of 131 mailed. There were no objections. For CAGSW, 75 ballots were mailed out and 52 had been returned as yes with zero no votes.

Sherry announced DCAGS will meet the first Thursday of the month at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints located at 4505 Regent. She also said that dues would be a flat rate of \$15 for the year. The DCAGS year will generally run from January through December, but this year there will be a 16-month period. Election of officers will be held at the November 2 meeting.

Below is a sample of a few of the stories. (Because of space limits, I will insert other stories in later newsletters.)

Joyce Nigbor spoke about the book she recently completed on her

great, great uncle, John William Asbach who fought for the north with the 3rd Iowa Vol. Cavalry, & died October 25, 1864 at the Battle of Mine Creek in Kansas.

Jack Murphy discussed the discoveries, which originally encouraged him to undertake the development of a genealogy and social history of his Murphy family and described some of the experiences he had leading up to the final publication of a book.

Sherry Lloyd mentioned the magazine *Internet Genealogy*, which is offering a free issue on line. The free issue includes a great article on German genealogy. The address for the magazine is www.internet-genealogy.com. The magazine is published by the same publishers as *Family Chronicle*, one of the best genealogy publications she has seen.

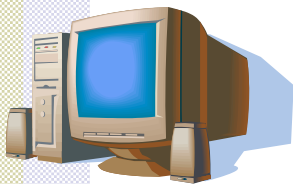

Judy Bates told about a genealogy written by her grandmother, when she was about 80 years old. Her grandmother's family lived in Gay Mills, Wisconsin, but decided to move to North Dakota in 1903. Not many family members seemed to know of this journey. Her grandmother told of the desolate conditions on the windblown plains. All the women hated it there and after a short time they moved back to Wisconsin.

Ruth Simpson showed an invitation and pictures from her parent's 50th wedding anniversary party in June. Her sister made a family quilt and they ordered stamps from www.zazzle.com with her parents' wedding picture.

Members enjoyed a great lunch of cake and ice cream. It was a great way for DCAGS to begin!

New Software: Personal Ancestry Writer II version for Macintosh

Personal Ancestry Writer (PAWriter II) is a free genealogy program for the Macintosh. We can now get version 50 in either of two versions, one for MacOS 8.6/9.x and one for MacOS X. It is modeled after Personal Ancestral File (PAF) for the Macintosh which has not been updated for many years.

Personal Ancestry Writer II has many of the same features as are

found in the PC version of PAF, which has been actively supported and updated, but is actively being developed and supported. Personal Ancestry Writer II works well on OS X, unlike the Macintosh version of PAF.

Personal Ancestry Writer II creates all text files in RTF format, which is compatible with AppleWorks, Microsoft Office for Macintosh, OpenOffice.org, or any

other word processor for editing. It also generates HTML files for the Web and desktop publishing files in MML format for Frame-Maker. These files include genealogical dictionaries, registers, ahnentafels and lineages, and other text files and pedigree charts.

Another Software Program: Family 1.2 for Macintosh

Family 1.2 is a new Macintosh genealogy program with a very intuitive user interface and requires no configuration. All information, including multimedia exhibits, is contained in a single file.

Family 1.2 is written as a Universal Binary file that runs on Intel as well

as pre-Intel Macs that use Mac OSX (10.4). The program has photo, video, and document management, and compatibility with iPhoto.

Family 1.2 sells for \$40. A demo version can be downloaded from the Web site.
